It was great to see the clinic again this year, especially as it's being so well maintained by our medical team; Jack & Julianna. Feedback from the local residents makes it obvious that it's performing a much needed and welcome service within the community.

Continuity of service has been improved over the past year through a monthly funds transfer to the clinic allowing vital medical supplies to always be available.

During this visit we have installed a television in the waiting area to show educational films to provide information on health issues and self-help disease/infection prevention methods.

When health information is not being shown we display the images from the newly installed cctv cameras (courtesy of Brian), which is a subtle way of saying 'burglars beware'.







We are now planning Phase II of our clinic.

Having run the clinic for some time now we understand that to operate at our full potential we need to upgrade our services through the provision of another building to accommodate more patients and perform more complex analysis of health issues on site rather than having to wait for test results from offsite services. We have the space, we have the design, we just need the money!

Our Latest Project

Whilst there we discussed plans and costs for a 2nd building with our builder Julius Okola who produced the above artist impression of what it would look like.

The separate building will provide significant benefits including separation of maternity care from infection/trauma patients, removal of dependency on outside agencies for sample analysis and separation of the staff living quarters from the clinic itself.

Our initial target to put up the building shell with roof is £28,500. A lot of money but a fraction of the cost it would be to create a similar building in the UK. Out and About Around Kisumu





Getting around in Kisumu is relatively easy, if slow due to the number of speed bumps. The main highways between major cities aren't bad, but once you venture into the countryside then it's a different story. Lack of tarmac leads to major potholes during the rainy season and mini dust storms when it's dry. Using car standard family proved to be а false economy in an area where wheel drive vehicles really are the order of the day.

One of the pleasures on our trips is to take some of our sponsored children and friends to 'World Cuisine' restaurants as a treat and a break from their normal diets. Kisumu is expanding and now offers a variety of cooking styles. In addition to quality Asian food there are European staples like Burger Bars, Pizza Houses, Chinese & Mexican restaurants. And you would never guess it from looking at the cattle, some of the best steaks I've ever had (I think they must be imported).
