Our Clinic is doing well and succeeding due to our fund raising and strong support from the UK. The Lions of Saffron Walden kindly donated enough money to restock our medical supplies and drugs whilst we were on our annual visit. Also during this years visit we purchased an additional bed and office chair for the clinic. Since our return we have also supplied a printer/scanner so patients can be given information on their treatment and medication. The clinic has now treated over 2000 patients. So we arranged for extra staff to help with the cooking of chicken stew, vegetables and chapattis for the children and staff. We played games including Musical Chairs, which both the children playing and the children watching totally enjoyed. Then they had their party food followed by balloons, sweets and lollipops to take home.
